



I. Celebrating the benefits of resurrection life (declaration)

- A. John 11:25 (NASB95) Jesus said to her, “I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me will live even if he dies,
- B. Romans 6:5 (NASB95) For if we have become united with Him in the likeness of His death, certainly we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection,
- C. 1 Corinthians 15:42–44 (NASB95) So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown a perishable body, it is raised an imperishable body; it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body.
- D. John 6:40 (NASB95) “For this is the will of My Father, that everyone who beholds the Son and believes in Him will have eternal life, and I Myself will raise him up on the last day.”
Redemption
- E. Colossians 1:13–14 (NASB95) For He rescued us from the domain of darkness, and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.
- F. **Regeneration**
- 2 Corinthians 5:17 (NASB95) Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.
- G. **Adoption**
- Romans 8:14–19 (NASB95) For all who are being led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God. For you have not received a spirit of slavery leading to fear again, but you have received a spirit of adoption as sons by which we cry out, “Abba! Father!” The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, heirs also, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him so that we may also be glorified with Him. For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us. For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God.
- H. **Justification**
- Romans 8:30 (NASB95) and these whom He predestined, He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, He also glorified.
- I. **Glorification**
- John 17:22 (NASB95) “The glory which You have given Me I have given to them, that they may be one, just as We are one;
- J. **Salvation**
- 1 Thessalonians 5:9 (NASB95) For God has not destined us for wrath, but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ,
- K. **Revelation**
- 12:10 (NASB95) Then I heard a loud voice in heaven, saying, “Now the salvation, and the power, and the kingdom of our God and the authority of His Christ have come, for the accuser of our brethren has been thrown down, he who accuses them before our God day and night.

L. **Empowerment**

- Philippians 3:10–11 (NASB95) that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death; in order that I may attain to the resurrection from the dead.

M. **Eternal hope**

- Revelation 20:6 (NASB95) Blessed and holy is the one who has a part in the first resurrection; over these the second death has no power, but they will be priests of God and of Christ and will reign with Him for a thousand years.

II. Calling people into resurrection life (intercession)

- A. John 7:37–38 (NASB95) Now on the last day, the great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, “If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink. “He who believes in Me, as the Scripture said, ‘From his innermost being will flow rivers of living water.’ ”
- B. Revelation 22:17 (NASB95) The Spirit and the bride say, “Come.” And let the one who hears say, “Come.” And let the one who is thirsty come; let the one who wishes take the water of life without cost.
- C. Matthew 11:28 (NASB95) “Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest.
- D. Matthew 19:14 (NASB95) But Jesus said, “Let the children alone, and do not hinder them from coming to Me; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.”
- E. John 5:39–40 (NASB95) “You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; it is these that testify about Me; and you are unwilling to come to Me so that you may have life.
- F. John 6:35 (NASB95) Jesus said to them, “I am the bread of life; he who comes to Me will not hunger, and he who believes in Me will never thirst.
- G. John 6:37 (NASB95) “All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will certainly not cast out.
- H. John 6:44 (NASB95) “No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him; and I will raise him up on the last day.

MyHOP Prayer Protocol:

1. Support the prayer time by focusing on the Lord.
2. Speak directly into the mic with a strong voice.
3. Stick to the theme established by the prayer leader.
4. Read a short scripture passage and pray short, to the point prayers.
Keep your emphasis on a single thought or phrase.
5. Pray, don't preach, teach, sing or prophesy.
6. Allow worship leader/singers time to respond.
7. The prayer leader will let you know when you may begin reading your scripture.
